This note (draft) presents some key facts about Antoine Vollon and his work; most information is drawn from the Martin (1923) booklet but also from the Tabler (1995) publication as well as author's own research.

1. VOLLON, HIS PERSONAL LIFE.

Born 20.04.1833 in Lyon, deceased in Parijs 27.08.1900, buried at Pere Lachaise Cemetery. Formal art education at the Ecole des Beaux Arts Lyon 1850 - 1852 He moves to Paris in 1859.

His family.

Antoine marries Marie-Fanny Boucher on May 12th 1860, who gives birth to daughter Marie-Gabrielle (1860.05.21) but allready dies in 1863.

His second child son Antoine (1865.05.12 - 1945) later takes the artist name Alexis Vollon.

His third child daughter Marguerite (1868.12.08 -) marries the painter Albert Decamps

His grandson Jacques-Antoine (1894 - 1977) also painted stillifes but ended his career before his thirtieth year.

Bernard, the only son of Jacques-Antoine and last male descendant of Antoine, now (2011) in his seventies, lives in the Normandy.

The website Gallica.bnf.fr displays a photograph with handwritten on it: Vollon Portrait de famille. It shows a gallant woman a boy standing, age some 8 years and another child, probably a girl, of some 3-4 years old, sitting on the ground. In front of the boy to the left a violin on a stool. The woman rests with her left hand on a piece of furniture, which might be a piano.

Question: is it Marie-Fanny in approx. 1873 with Alexis and Marguerite, or is it may be

Alexis 's wife Mathilde Mardout, the elegant professional piano-player, with her sons Pierre (1890 - .) and Jacques-Antoine (02.09.1894 - 1975)

g **2. Living in Paris**

Vollon is reported to have arrived from Lyon in Paris in 1859. Martin (1923, p. 56) lists his different addresses in Paris as follows:

The cadastral documentation states that a farmhouse in Mers was in Vollon ownership from 1863 till 1882, with formal ownership transferred sometime in the years between, from father Antoine to son Alexis (1865-1945).

In that registration two Paris addresses are noted:

Rue Treilhard, which is close to the Abattoir du Roule Rue Cour....

A street in Paris has been named after him: rue Antoine Vollon, situated in the 12th district A visit to Paris in April 2003, showed this street, just North of Gare de Lyon ; a side-street of Rue du Faubourg. A photograph was taken to evidence the occasion.

Catoir (2002), p. 36 specifies that the Societe des Amis de Bessancourt has placed in 1968 a plaque on the wall of his Bessancourt atelier, to be found at the rue Antoine Vollon nr. 3 reading: « Ici était l'atelier du peintre Antoine Vollon 1833-1900 « .

Author's site visit to Bessancourt in 2003 confirmed this and evidenced it by a photograph.

In Mers, after publication of the cadastral findings of 2001 (see above), the community decided in 2004 to name a small new quarter on the cliff north-west of the small village after Antoine Vollon

From his work in Paris as far as known today, some 60 works, some seventy-five percent pictures the Seine and its bridges and nearby buildings and twenty-five percent depicts other objects in the city.

3. The artist Vollon as professional

The artist in Paris under the Third Republic had several means to find his clients and generate an income for his family.

In his first years Cadart was an important client.

He also participated in the 1866-1867 trade mission by . . into the United States.

Comte Nieuwerkerque was his patron until the 1870-1871 revolution.

A major outlet in his earlier days was Goupil.

INTENSITY, CHARACTER AND PROCEEDS OF ARTIST-SUPPLY

Vollon supplied some 68 works to Goupil in their first 10 years of business-relation.

We see that some 33 % must be characterised as N.M.'s and some 45% as Paysage.

We also see that over a ten years period Antoine Vollon achieved an income at Goupil of some FFr 112.000. This is quite a significant amount considering that a school-teacher would make a year's income of some FFr...

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4. HIS WORK.

Antoine Vollon is most known for his stil life painting; some called him, in a a bit flattering way, the 19th century Chardin.

From 1870 onwards he also paints landscapes or Paysage and only in the eighties showing them incidentally at the Salon.

Curious in his work but not uncommon to painters in his period, is that at several moments early in his career he accepted commisions to copy, as he did with a Frans Hals, for which he travelled to the Dutch city of Haarlem, evidenced by his signing of the museums guest register in 1871 and 1872. He visited as well the Amsterdam Trippenhuis (now Rijksmuseum) on July 24th 1871.

Another curious element in Vollon works is the great number of works showing fish (poisson); most certainly some of these works are not everybody's taste.

The contrast of some of the Poisson paintings with the fine Stilllife paintings is a bit shocking.

The artistic production of Vollon is subject of ongoing research by Berkelder since 1999, at this moment over 900 works have been identified. Of those works about one quarter is now (summer 2009) known by present location.

The identification leads to a count when a title, the dimensions plus a unconditional attribution is presented in the sales or exhibition catalogue.

A few works appearing with addition "genre de" or "attributed to " have off course not been counted in this respect.

COAST AND HARBOUR SCENES.

An interesting part of Vollons works have coast, river and harbour as the subject, which is Berkelder's primary personal interest.

Vollon has from 1864 to 1882 been the owner of a farm at Mers near Le Treport at the Normandy coast, as evidenced by the autumn-2001 discovery of an entry in the Ancienne Matrice Cadastrale (documentary find upon instigation of Berkelder by Messrs Maes (Le Treport) et Allegrand (Mers), as reported in the local normandy newspaper L'Informateur of Novembre 8 2001 as well as the paper's website

After the railway line in Oise valley was completed in 1878, he settled in the eighties in Bessancourt where he commisioned a house plus atelier, which out of dissatisfaction with the result, however was quickly sold. He returned to the old farmhouse in Bessancourt main street. A plaquette in the small village recalls Antoine's days in Bessancourt.

Surprising from the dutch point of view is the practical absence of works on Dordrecht, Scheveningen, Rotterdam or Amsterdam, though he was at the Haarlem Frans Hals Museum (July 22^{nd} or 23^{rd}) and at the Amsterdam Trippenhuis (now Rijksmuseum) on July 24^{th} 1871 and again in Haarlem (A. Vollon peintre Paris) in early November 1872, that time joined by his pupil Robert Mols (Robert Mols peintre Anvers). Photo evidence from the Haarlem register is available at Berkelder.

The Haarlem register is kept in the Archiefdienst Kennemerland in Haarlem. The Trippenhuis Register of 1871 is kept at Prentenkabinet Rijksmuseum Amsterdam.

Petra Chu – ten Doeschate (1974) also reports a visit to the Mauritshuis The Hague in 1868.

About 5 works explicitly bear a reference to the Netherlands in its title, some Marines may also represent dutch locations.

This becomes the more curious as his friend Eugene Boudin, with whom he was in Antwerpen in Summer 1871, produced some 135 works picturing Dutch scenes.

A general source of information on art in the Netherlands, and thus also on Vollon is the Rijksbureau voor Kunsthistorische Documentatie (RKD) in The Hague

Berkelder has produced a database with reference to over 2300 catalogues of public auctions in France and some in the UK, the Netherlands and the USA, since 1870 to present days, where works of Vollon where on offer.

The research (January 2008 status: approx. 25.500 auction catalogues reviewed) is still in progress and thus the database of both Vollon-relevant catalogues as well as the oeuvre database is still in development.

The research has enabled adding unknown provenance to several well known works in top museums.

4. VOLLON'S IN MUSEA AROUND THE WORLD.

Please be aware that several musea keep Vollon in store or depot, so an appointment with museum – staff is necessary in order to go and see the works. In the Netherlands, the Vollons are usually on public display in Mesdag Museum The Hague, the Centraal Museum Utrecht as well as in the Gouda Museum.
